Lafayette Musicians Excel in Local, Regional, National Honor Bands

Has it occurred to anyone else how much control weather seems to have over our activities? I missed seeing you all at the December parent meeting and hope that you all enjoyed some rest during the semester break. It seems like a long time ago, doesn't it? And especially with the snow days that seem to be breaking our rhythm with frustrating regularity.

Despite the inclement weather, though, there are good things going on with our students. The second semester of Mastering Musicianship has been launched and before the break, 32 students auditioned for All-State groups and 15 of them were selected to participate in band, jazz band and orchestra. Their names are listed on page 2 and I hope you'll

congratulate them when you see them. These groups will perform as part of the Kentucky Music Educators' Association conference in Louisville February 9-12.

The Lafayette Wind Symphony was invited to perform for the conference, and will travel to Louisville for that performance on Thursday, Feb. 10. I'm sure they will represent us well in that performance which will feature Allen Vizzutti and Vince DiMartino as guest artists.

We had 94 students audition for District Seven Honor Band and 46 were selected to participate. Because of inclement weather (!), the event has been rescheduled for March 24-26. This isn't the first time district band has been affected by weather conditions and I'm thankful that it was possible to schedule it later in the semester when the chances of inclement weather are not as great.


