It's time!!!

Two weeks until the start of Band Camp and the beginnings of what looks to be a GREAT year for the Lafayette Band! First-time Marchers/Percussion/Color Guard Camp begins on July 18 with the upper classmen winds joining in on June 25. We are very excited about the possibilities and hope that you are, too! (PLEASE, make sure that your child's forms are complete and turned in so they can start camp!)

Please take strong notice of some basic Band Camp rules put forth by Tim Hall and the Chaperone Crew on page 4. Have your child eat breakfast, wear sunscreen, and take full advantage of water breaks. These three simple rules are so very important! Our Chaperone Crew is top notch and very experienced as you will see with Band Camp beginning.

July 18 is also the first LBA Parent Meeting. We will meet in the Lafayette Cafeteria at 7 p.m. This meeting is very important in that it provides families with their greatest opportunities to meet other parents, hear about plans for the upcoming season (including information about this fall's marching show!), and, most importantly, begin to find where they

may fit into the volunteer efforts of LBA. We cannot stress enough that there is a role for every parent in this organization and that all of you have skills that can make this organization just that much better. Please get involved in some way. We need volunteers for our Chaperone Crew, Field Crew, Food Crew, Uniform Crew, and fundraising coordination. Please note that, due to insurance requirements, all LBA volunteers must be members of the organization.

Also on the 18th, you will begin to hear about our LBA fundraising efforts for the year. Carole and Tom Howell, our first vice-presidents, with the help of many fundraising coordinators, will lead these efforts. We all bear the burden of assuring funding for this organization and half of our LBA budget comes from fundraising. Fundraising also means Bingo. If you have not as yet communicated with your section "pull tab" coordinator, please do so on the 18th. All families are asked to cover three to six Bingo "pull tab" slots during the band year.

One additional group you will hear from on the 18th is our Uniform Crew, headed by Cindy Blanton. Cindy and her crew will fit all of the students for their uniforms during Band Camp. On the 18th, she will briefly talk about

uniform and shoe needs and care.

August 5 is the date for the end of Band Camp Parent Performance and Cookout where we will all get our first glimpse of the 2011 version of "The Pride of The Bluegrass!" This will be the first Band Camp Parent Performance to take place in the new Ishmael Stadium and it will be great—we've ordered sunshine and temperatures in the 70s! After feeding 200 marching Generals for two weeks, our Food Crew, led by Randy and Allisa Garland, will be working with Columbia Steakhouse to feed all of us and make this a wonderful celebration of many hours of hard work.

Tips for a Successful Band Camp

- Lafayette Band Camp begins on Monday, July 18, for all first-time marchers, color guard and percussion.
- Camp continues the weeks of Monday, July 25 and August 1 for all Band members.
- Band Camp attendance is MANDATORY.
- All students are to report to the Band room at 8 a.m. each day.
- The lunch break is from noon to 1 p.m. daily. Lunch is NOT provided during the week of July 18. Please plan accordingly.
- Get a good night's sleep every night and eat a good breakfast every morning.
- No visitors on campus during the day, even during the lunch break.
- Lunch IS provided during the two weeks of full Band Camp.
- All participants' information forms and medical permits must be turned in BEFORE camp begins. If we do not have these forms, you cannot participate for safety reasons. Forms can be accessed at www.lafayetteband.org.
- Wear supportive tennis shoes and socks every day. NO open-toed shoes are allowed.
- Drink lots of water before, during and after practice. Water breaks are frequent.
- Wear sunscreen, SPF 15 or higher.
- Bring a hat – and wear it. Hat hair is encouraged and very cool.
- Expect and dress for high temperatures and humidity.

FUNDRAISING NOTES

The kick-off date for sale of the Lafayette Band Association Discount Card will be July 18, the first parent meeting of the season. There will be no Blitz Day, as we have had in the past, so chairperson Kim Burns is asking everyone to make an extra effort to sell these

valuable cards to family and friends.

The card has offers from several local businesses, including Joseph-Beth Booksellers, J.J. McBrewsters, Newport Cleaners and the new Fro-Jo's in Lexington Green (buy one, get one free!)

Band members are encouraged to continue selling cards until August 18—classmates and even teachers are always eager to buy cards!

The in-lieu payment for discount cards is \$50, if you decide to opt out of this fundraiser.

In addition to such fund-raising efforts as sale of discount cards, cheese and sausage, fruit and wreaths, mulch and raffle tickets, the Band sponsors the on-going fundraisers listed here. Please make every effort to participate in these activities.

Bingo

LBA sponsors bingo at the Bluegrass Bingo Center on Clays Mill Road every Tuesday and Thursday night. Every Band family is asked to work at Bingo three to six times a year. If you have not signed up to work, you will be contacted by Vivian Salley (if your student plays a woodwind instrument), Jill Richeson (brass) or Gayla Webb (color guard or percussion). The board of directors and activity chairpersons staff the first week of the month; if you fall into that group, you will be contacted by Sara Maggard. Volunteers are asked to arrive at the Bingo center between 5:30 and 6 p.m. and to remain until play concludes at about 10 p.m. Bingo is the single most lucrative fundraiser that LBA has and we need participation from everyone to maximize profits. If you haven't signed up for your Bingo nights, please do so ASAP.

Kroger Cards

Remember to use your Kroger card for groceries, gas, prescriptions, etc. The Band receives a four percent contribution for every purchase you make with your card. New members of the Lafayette Band Association receive a \$5 card as a "thank you" for joining.

On-Line Shopping and Searching

Earn money for the Band by using GoodSearch as your search engine and shopping online at GoodShop, an online shopping mall of over 100 of your favorite merchants dedicated to helping fund worthy causes across the country. Each purchase made via GoodShop results in a donation to LBA, averaging about three percent of the sale, but going to 20 percent or even more. Enter Lafayette Band Association to credit LBA. You will earn a fraction of a cent each time you use GoodSearch and those fractions really add up!

Restaurant Fundraisers (Year-Round)

Throughout the year, LBA families gather to enjoy a meal together and support the Band at area restaurants that donate a percentage of the day's sales to the Band. Opportunities will be announced at Band meetings, in the monthly newsletter, the weekly news and on the website (www.lafayetteband.org).

Volunteering with the Lafayette Band Association

Please look over these many volunteer opportunities available for families of the Band before the parent meeting on July 18. The success of the Lafayette Band depends on input from every family and we need help from everyone! Each hour that is contributed goes far in reducing the cost of Band participation for all our families. The cost of participation has remained lower than many other area bands and shows the LBA commitment to keep costs down for our families. Below is a brief summary of the many ways you might choose to support LBA with your time or money.

BAND STORE. The Lafayette Band Store sells items that feature Lafayette, the Band logo, and trademarks of the “Pride of the Bluegrass”®, including T-shirts, sweatshirts, jackets, hats, flags, and many more items. There are various opportunities to volunteer in the Band Store, some of which include working to choose new items to sell, creating graphic art designs for new merchandise, helping fold and organize merchandise, and preparing for sales at practices, football games and contests. The Band Store is fully automated with a Point of Sale system that tracks sales, orders and inventory. Working in the Band Store is a great way to use your creative abilities to benefit the Band, and it is also a great way to meet other members of the Band family. **Contact Rick and Carla Hagerman at lafayettebandstore@gmail.com, 224-8339 or 533-7121.**

CHAPERONES. There are three levels of chaperones. The Event Chaperones attend games, parades and other local events. Day Chaperones travel with the band when there are no overnight stays. Travel Chaperones do all of the events including day trips and overnight travel. Volunteers could start out as Event Chaperones and then learn the system and move to a different level. Chaperones accompany the band at all times, beginning at Band Camp, when they distribute ice packs, aspirin and TLC; through football season when they station themselves in the band section of the stands and cheer for the Generals; and on into the competition season when they travel on buses (passing out candy and cookies!) and sit for long hours in hotel hallways in the middle of the night after “lights out.” The LBA chaperone crew assures the health and safety of the Band. This crew requires the ability to function effectively on coffee instead of sleep. **Contact Tim Hall, 224-4426, timjanhall@insightbb.com.**

COLOR GUARD. This crew makes sure the color guard is dressed properly and ready to take the field in costume, with hair and make-up done. Preparation is done on-site, whether in the cafeteria for football games, or in assigned rooms at competitions. Although a few will travel with color guard, the biggest need is helping the girls with hair. Moms or dads that can help are always welcome. A tolerance for the scent of hairspray and gel is essential. **Contact Becky Ramsey, 260-7793.**

FIELD CREW. The field crew usually travels ahead of the Band, loads and unloads uniforms, instruments, and backdrops, basically everything but the kids. They’re also responsible for getting everything on the field, usually in a very small amount of time. The field crew also produces whatever projects Mr. Smith and the rest of the staff devise. Therefore, skills for building, fabricating, or just plain man (or woman) power, are essential. Wherever you see the Band, you’ll see the field crew. Workers need a strong back and a great sense of humor. **Contact Joey Maggard, 277-7893, jsmag@insightbb.com.**

FOOD CREW. Volunteer opportunities as a part of the food crew would include your choice of the following: Serving meals at Band Camp, mini camps and before competitions (Usually from 10:30-1:30 – includes setting up, serving and cleaning up). Serving opportunities are available to fit your schedule – whether it’s only a couple of times or every time, you are welcome any time to help serve meals. Baking cookies and other treats is also a huge way to get plugged in for parents who want to help with food but can’t physically be at school serving. Just bring four dozen cookies or treats to our “cookie lady” in the parking lot when you drop your child off in the morning (Tues. and Thurs. mornings during band camp; mornings of mini camps and competitions). **Contact Alissa Garland, 224-0483, alissa.garland@insightbb.com.**

UNIFORM CREW. The uniform crew keeps the Band looking good. They measure and fit for uniforms (both traditional and competition). After football games and competitions, the uniform crew makes sure all uniforms are accounted for and in good repair. While the Band dresses, the crew is on hand with emergency sewing equipment, pins and sometimes even duct tape and hot glue. **Contact Cindy Blanton, 224-8526, cmbanton@insightbb.com.**

Bingo. LBA members staff the Bluegrass Bingo Center, 3340 Holwyn Rd, off Clays Mill Road, for our weekly, year-round, Bingo operation on Tuesday and Thursday nights. This is our largest fundraiser, earning over \$50,000! Money earned each week pays a large percentage of the funds needed to support the Band. Ten to 12 volunteers are needed for each session (several parents work more than night month). Profits from Bingo go into the association's general fund. This is a major time and energy commitment on the part of the association and the profits have made the effort very worthwhile. **Contact Darryl Duncan, 277-1435, darryl.duncan@insightbb.com**.

Discount Card Fundraiser (July). A perennial community favorite, the annual Lafayette Band Discount Card Fundraiser kicks off at the first LBA Parent Meeting in July. The Discount Card is sold for \$10 and provides year long savings and buy-one, get-one free offers at merchants located throughout Lexington. The cards serve both as a fundraiser for the Lafayette Band and as an advertisement for businesses in our community.

Football Program (July/August). Advertisement Sales for the LHS Football Program begins in mid-July and continues through early August. Previous advertisers include local businesses, restaurants, physicians, dental and legal practices, churches, political campaigns, financial institutions, and parents! The Football Program Committee will distribute information on this fundraiser via the Band's newsletter, mass email, and at LBA Parent Meetings. LBA receives profits from advertisement sales AND program sales at Lafayette home football games! **Contact Peggy Gabriel, 608-2946, mgabriel@insightbb.com**.

Cheese and Sausage Fundraiser (August). The Lafayette Band Association kicks off the school year in August selling quality Wisconsin Real Cheese, Summer Sausage varieties/ gift packs, high-quality wrapping paper, and premium candles. This fundraiser provides a wonderful opportunity to prepare for upcoming holidays, while supporting the Lafayette Band.

Fruit Fundraiser (November/December). The "community favorite" fruit sales begin in November. In addition to a variety of citrus fruits, we offer country hams, apples, pears, baking nuts and decorative fruit gift boxes. Corporate orders are accepted.

Goodshop (www.goodsearch.com). Earn money for the band by searching and shopping online at GoodSearch or GoodShop. GoodShop, an online shopping mall of over 100 of your favorite merchants dedicated to helping fund worthy causes across the country. Each purchase made via the GoodShop mall results in a donation to the Lafayette Band Association averaging approximately three percent of the sale, but going up to 20 percent or even more. Just enter "Lafayette Band Association" to credit LBA.

Kroger Gift Card (Year-Round). By purchasing a Kroger gift card through the Lafayette Band, you will earn money for the band without spending any extra money or selling a thing. New LBA members receive a \$5 gift card as a "thank you" for joining and families are encouraged to purchase as many cards as they have people shopping at Kroger.

Mulch Fundraiser (March/April). In March/April, the Lafayette Band offers landscape quality bagged mulch (premium cypress and black platinum hardwood mulch) in two-cubic feet bags. A mass mailing to the Lafayette community is mailed in February and orders are taken through March. LBA offers free delivery for customers placing a minimum order of six bags. Corporate orders are accepted.

Raffle (April/May). This is one of the largest fundraisers for the band. Each spring, the Lafayette Band features its most profitable fundraiser of the year - the ANNUAL RAFFLE - \$10,000 GIVEAWAY. One winner receives the GRAND PRIZE OF \$10,000. Ticket sales begin in April and continue for a three-week period. NOTE: *This Raffle is conducted according to the rules and regulations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Charitable Gaming. (Lafayette Band Association, Inc., Gaming License Number ORG0000841.) Winner is solely responsible for applicable federal and state taxes on prize.*

Restaurant Fundraisers (Year-Round). Throughout the year, LBA families have the opportunity to enjoy a meal together and support the band. These announcements will be made via weekly e-news, on the website, and in the monthly newsletter.
