Challenges met, challenges faced

It's hard to believe that the 2010-11 school year is coming to a close, isn't it? But in the next few days we will see the Class of 2011 cross the stage at Rupp Arena, move their tassels and join thousands before them who proudly call themselves graduates of Lafayette High School. I commend their efforts and wish them all the best during their college years and beyond.

As we bid farewell to the seniors, we also look ahead to the summer months and make plans for the coming marching season. Although the particulars will not be revealed until class meetings on July 7, I've heard some intriguing rumors about the 2011 show. I haven't confirmed or denied anything but have told students they'll find out soon enough!

Turning to more serious issues, the coming year will be a critical time for the Band's fundraising efforts. The 2011-12 budget includes a "sinking fund" for both uniforms and instruments. Both funds have been set up as a line item on the budget so we'll have money set aside for expenses we know are coming up. We still think of our uniforms as new, but they have a life of about five to seven years and we since reached that five year mark at the end of the 2010 marching season, it is prudent to make plans to replace uniforms, as needed. Thanks to Cindy Blanton and the uniform crew for the care and repair they provide for our uniforms, holding off that expenditure as long as possible.

We also need to make plans

to replace our sousaphones, which I estimate will cost in the neighborhood of \$65,000. We last replaced sousas in 1990, so those horns are several years older than any of the students who play them! Because sousas make such a visual statement for the band, we must replace all of them at the same time.

We're also looking down the road to replacing percussion equipment, which will cost far less than the sousas, but will still be about \$10,000. I believe that making these purchases is essential to maintaining the top-notch quality of the Lafayette Band.

That quality was in clear evidence at the District Seven Festival at Scott County High School on April 29. The Concert Band, Symphonic Band and Wind Symphony all received distinguished rankings from festival judges. Well done, students!

You continued your distinguished performances at the Jazz Band Concert and at the Spring Concert at the Singletary Center on May 18. Thanks for your hard work and dedication throughout the year and at the end of the year concerts.

We'll all enjoy a little down time after school gets out, but we still have several activities and events throughout the summer months. The Asbury Leadership Workshop we've sponsored each summer for the last several years is planned for June 15. I highly encourage students to participate in the day's activities which help the Band to begin the necessary process of bonding.

Students Recognized at Annual Banquet and Honors Ceremony

The Lafayette Band Association recognized the Class of 2011 and distributed bars, letters and awards to the Band at its annual Banquet and Honors Ceremony at Calvary Baptist Church on Sunday, May 1. The banquet capped off a full weekend for students who also participated in the KMEA District Seven Festival on Friday, Apr. 29 and the Lafayette Prom on Apr. 30.

The Senior Farewell was given by Hayley Collins and Jordan Evans, who began their remarks by thanking the Band moms who work on the food and uniform crews. “Without them, we would be hungry and naked,” Hayley said.

The two reminisced about their four years, beginning with their freshman year, comparing the Band to a family that includes a “kooky uncle and a cool grandpa—Mr. Larkin and Mr. Warren. And course, Mom and Dad—Doc and Mr. Smith,” a comment that was met with huge applause.

As sophomores, the class related to the “boy meets girl” story of *Allure* and “we learned that if you love what you do, you’ll never work a day in your life,” Jordan said.

The Class of 2011 was called to step into leadership roles as juniors because of the small size of the Class of 2010 and as seniors they drew on those leadership skills in October, when “we got better and we got better fast!” Jordan said. The two displayed their their KMEA medals and of the 2010 medal, said, “The ribbon might be yellow, but this is still a blue ribbon band!”

Jordan and Hayley concluded their reflection saying, “Mr. Smith told us it wouldn’t be easy, but he never told us how hard it would be to say
